La Paz County 'Passport To Adventure'



This week, a kickoff of a county-wide promotion will take place at the Bluewater Casino attended by 150 area businesses and community leaders. The "Passport to Adventure" is a promotional 24 page calendar booklet developed by a group of individuals who came together as a result of the Focus Future II program conducted by the La Paz Economic Development Corporation. The Tourism Group devised the promotion intended to promote attendance at community events throughout the La Paz County area.

The "Passport Book" contains instructions on how to participate in the "Passport Program," short informational pieces on La Paz County and about its communities, and a list of events and activities throughout the entire County. From October through mid-March the Passport Book will be available throughout La Paz County. At each of the identified 'Stampable' community event/activity, the participants can have their Passport stamped with the stamp unique to that community. Stamps from at least 3 events in any community will earn tickets into the prize drawings to be held at the La Paz County Fair in March 2016.

All tickets are eligible for all prizes. Winners need not be present to win but will need to make arrangements to pick up any prizes won.

Hallucinogenic and Toxic Desert Plants

A large percentage of drugs and other chemicals have properties that are contained in plants. Some of these chemicals are useful to us. Some are harmful. Probably the most harmful plants come from the Nightshade family.

The Nightshade family contains both hallucinogenic and poisonous plants. Hallucinogenic plants include Sacred datura [Datura innoxia], small Datura [D discolor], and Jimson weed [D stramonium]. All produce hallucinogenic reactions and should be avoided. These plants are probably not addictive but are dangerous. Poisonous plants in this family are black and silver nightshade, black henbane, wright's ground-cherry, and bitter nightshade. This family includes plants we enjoy in our gardens and super markets. Tomato, potato, and pepper plants are all toxic except the fruit or vegetable part we eat. Not all nightshade family plants have been mentioned here, but if it is in this family it is toxic.

For specific plants you suspect may be toxic, contact our office. We can look your suspect plant up and let you know if there is a toxin in the plant. Contact us at 928 669-9843 or visit our office at 2524 Mutahar just off Shea road.

The Red Ribbon Campaign is the oldest and largest drug prevention program in the nation, reaching millions of young people during Red Ribbon Week each year. The parade begins at 10am from the Bouse Booster Club, ending at the park.
